



Eligibility Requirements

- The minimum gift required for participation is \$250 (\$150 tax credit).
- The maximum allowed is \$125,000 (\$75,000 credit).
- Only C-Corporations are eligible.
- The gift must be cash/check.
- The tax credit is issued to the company for its next state filing after Dec. 31, regardless of the dates of the company's fiscal year.
- A one-page form must be submitted to the Department of Revenue Services between Sept. 15 and Oct. 1.
- A participating company is required to match or surpass its previous year's level of total charitable giving.

The Connecticut Neighborhood Assistance Act



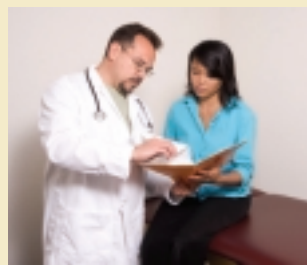
What is the Connecticut Neighborhood Assistance Act?

The Connecticut Neighborhood Assistance Act is legislation which, since 1985, has provided substantial corporate tax credits to Connecticut companies making charitable contributions to approved programs at non-profit organizations.

Four programs at Waterbury Hospital have been approved for 2009. Corporate supporters will receive a tax credit equal to 60 percent of their gift.

A "credit," different from a mere deduction, is subtracted directly from the bottom line of taxes owed.

Opportunity 1: Waterbury Health Access Program

Caring for the Uninsured

The Waterbury Health Access Program provides case management, eligibility enrollment, pharmacy assistance, free specialist care from community physicians and lab and radiology testing. Over 6,000 residents have obtained services at five access points: Waterbury and Saint Mary's Hospital's Emergency Rooms, Chase Clinic, Stay Well Health Center and Family Health Center. WHAP is able to leverage \$1.54 of donated services for every \$1.00 of contributions.

Opportunity 3: Waterbury Parent Leadership Training Institute

Developing Community Leaders

The Waterbury Parent Leadership Training Institute has trained and graduated over 150 parents since 2000. The intensive five-month class offered free of charge, meets weekly and teaches leadership and advocacy skills to parents. They also learn the process by which state and local governments enact and change laws.

Opportunity 2: Waterbury Hospital EMT/MRT Training Program

Training the Workforce of the Future

The Waterbury Hospital Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)/Medical Response Technician (MRT) Training Program at Wilby High School is a 140-hour, hospital-sponsored program offered free of charge to Wilby students. The program produces the region's newest crop of emergency medical responders. Federal estimates show that the need for EMT's will increase by 19 percent through 2016. MRT training is required for police and firefighter training.

Keeping Patients Safe

The Waterbury Hospital Hand Hygiene Campaign was developed by the CDC to educate all hospital workers to wash their hands before and after any patient contact. Two million people each year become ill as a result of hospital-acquired infections resulting in about 90,000 deaths and \$4.5 billion in medical costs! Funding is needed to purchase educational materials to make Waterbury Hospital the safest environment possible.
